They explore the physical geography of earthquakes and the amazing features of Japan including mountains and volcanoes
Year 6	South America. The children go on a voyage of discovery to South America as they learn about the countries, culture and geography of this fascinating continent. They will learn about the climate, the geographical features, the industries and the people of South America giving them an insight into how life in South America is different to life here in the UK	Extreme Earth. Children explore the Earth's greatest natural disasters and extreme weather phenomena, from raging tropical storms to violent erupting volcanoes to terrifying towering tsunamis.	Africa The children head out on a fascinating journey as they discover the amazing continent of Africa. Exploring each of the five regions, children will start to get an understanding of just how diverse the continent of Africa is and find out about the human and physical geography of a number of African countries.
